DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I have a favorite word: gratitude. I like this word so much that I even have a tattoo on my foot that constantly reminds me of how to live in the present, regardless of circumstance—"gratitude." Throughout the losses, obstacles, isolation, and feelings of scarcity that the last year has brought, I revel in gratitude for being able to make music together again, for rehearsing together in one space safely, and for having a live audience (YOU!) experience art with us as we play and discover in real time. The title *Ordinary Days* might seem an odd choice as we surpass the one-year mark of a pandemic where very little has been ordinary. However, this musical exhibits the opportunity to find gratitude for all that we took for granted before our world turned upside down.

Through the New York mishaps and rom-com circumstances, Ordinary Days intrigues us to gain perspective around our personal "big picture." Warren tells us at the end of the show, "Things aren't beautiful all on their own. Beautiful comes from reflection . . . For beautiful to happen, the beautiful has got to be seen." It's with ordinary eyes that we witness you sharing this live art form with us tonight and with ordinary hearts that we thank you for being part of our big picture.

PROFILES



Lisa Buhelos (Deb) is a first-year master's student in vocal performance and literature at the University of Illinois where she studies under Yvonne Redman and Sarah Wigley. Recently, she has been seen in Lyric Theatre @ Illinois' production of *The Adventures*

of Little Sharp-Ears as Sharp-Ears, the Vixen. She has also been seen in Lyric Theatre @ Illinois' productions of Crazy For You (Margie), La Bohème (Ensemble), The Pirates of Penzance (Ensemble), and the workshop of Take Flight (Brenda). Buhelos has participated in the American Institute of Music in Graz, Austria, where she was a soloist for the AIMs Festival Orchestra and the AIMs Operetta Concert. Previous scene performances include Sophie from Der Rosenkavalier, Mademoiselle Siberklang from Der Schauspieldirektor, Marie from La fille du régiment, and Susanna from Le Nozze di Figaro.

A graduate of the Honors College at WSU, his special thesis images of their gods: a song cycle for voice and piano was awarded the merit of Pass with Distinction. Recently, Mynka took part in Boston Conservatory's Summer Opera Intensive in Valencia, Spain, and the Franco-American Vocal Academy's Mozart Academy in Salzburg, Austria. His roles with Lyric Theatre @ Illinois include Songs for a New World, Ernst in Cabaret, Henrik in the pandemiccanceled A Little Night Music.



Madysen Simanonis (Claire) is currently a junior at the University of Illinois pursuing a BMA in lyric theatre. She is studying voice under the direction of Sarah Wigley. Her Lyric Theatre @ Illinois credits include Lyric Under the Stars (Soloist) and Crazy for You

(Louise). In the fall of 2019, Simanonsis took a semester off to work with The Walt Disney Company in Florida as a character performer. She has also been seen in Illini Student Musicals' productions of *Mamma Mia!* (Ali) and *A Chorus Line* (Sheila). Last semester, she had the opportunity to direct a showcase with Illini Student Musicals.



Sarah Wigley (Stage Director) Sarah Wigley is a clinical assistant professor of voice for Lyric Theatre @ Illinois at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign where she instructs Lyric Theatre Studio, Musical Theatre Repertoire, and Singing in Musical Theatre

while maintaining a private voice studio of over 20 students. Frequently stage-directing both opera and musical theatre, directing credits with Lyric Theatre @Illinois include Crazy for You, She Loves Me, Kiss Me Kate, The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee, [title of show], A Psalm of Silence, and both La Bohème and Don Giovanni in collaboration with Nathan Gunn. Wigley holds an MM in voice performance from Colorado State University and a BM in voice from the University of Minnesota. While residing in Minneapolis, Wigley performed professionally with regional companies such as the Guthrie Theatre, the Skylark Opera, The Mystery Café, the Minnesota Centennial Showboat, and the Minnesota Opera. Her Denver credits include roles such as Aldonza in Man of La Mancha, Emma in Jekyll and Hyde, Dolores in The Wild Party, and Miss Scarlett in CLUE The Musical. Wigley has served as faculty for the Musical Theatre Department at the University of Northern Colorado as well as Parlando School for the Arts in Boulder, Colorado, and has had several students appear on Broadway and in national tours and regional theatres across the nation. As a contemporary voice specialist, Wigley is Estill Voice Figure Proficiency Certified, frequently presenting workshops concerning flexible voice technique and crossover training for both studio voice teachers and choral educators. Sessions ranging from "Crossing Over: Contemporary Voice Technique for Solo and Ensemble Singing" to "Crossing Genres: A Classical Singer's Guide to Jazz" have energized the International Congress of Voice Teachers in Stockholm, Sweden, the National Association for Teachers of Singing, Illinois Music Education Association, Iowa Choral Directors Association, and Minnesota Music Education Association. Wigley's students are frequently awarded as finalists in musical theatre competitions for the National Association for Arts and Letters and the National Association for Teachers of Singing, and she currently serves as Director of Communication for the Chicago Chapter of the National Association for Teachers of Singing. Wigley recently had the pleasure of creating Franc D'Ambrosio's new touring show Beyond the Chandelier and enjoys yoga and golf when not music making.



Ty Tuttle (Music Director) is a pianist and musical theatre coach, currently pursuing his MM in vocal coaching/ accompanying at the University of Illinois Urbana-Champaign. With an undergraduate degree from Eastern Illinois University,

Tuttle has established himself as an accomplished musician and music director in the Central Illinois area. Previous productions include *Oklahoma!*, *Newsies* (The Little Theatre on the Square) and *The Last Five Years* (Station Theatre). He has also performed in concerts, masterclasses, and more with such performers as Allen Vizzutti, Molly Ringwald, Julian Ovenden, and others.



Bree Brock (Stage Manager) is a production coordinator at Krannert Center for the Performing Arts. She has been employed there for two years and is deeply in love with her job. She has had the privilege of working with both local and non-local artists, students, and

her incredible peers. Brock is originally from Kansas City, Missouri, and has a BFA in theatre management. She is excited to receive the opportunity of stage managing this production.
